

What is Celiac Disease?

It is an autoimmune disease that injures the lining of the intestine when gluten-containing foods are ingested. Gluten is found in wheat, barley, rye, and often oats. There is no known cure for the disease and no medicine to treat it. Yet, with a gluten free diet, good health can be regained and maintained.
